We are proud to announce that the Woodturners of Southwest Missouri will be hosting Ron Fleming.

Ron Fleming is a native of Oklahoma. He was a professional illustrator and has turned his full attention to his work in wood. He is represented in Los Angeles, Philadelphia, Detroit, and Santa Fe.

Fleming is active in the American Association of Woodturners and the Wood Turning Center where he is currently serving on the board of trustees.

Ron Fleming has received many awards for his work, including a 1989 purchase award from the Vision Makers Show which was sponsored by the States Arts Council of Oklahoma, a purchase award from the 1992 Regional Craft Biennial, sponsored by the Arkansas Arts Center, Little Rock, AR, and the Grand Prize Award in the 1991 American Craft Awards, sponsored by Kraus Sikes, Inc, and recently a cash award from the Vision Makers show sponsored by the State Arts council of Oklahoma.

In 1993 Michael Monroe, the curator of the Smithsonian's Renwick Gallery, asked Ron to donate a piece to the White House permanent craft collection as part of it's observance of the Year of the American Craft.

Join us for a two-part program by Ron starting at 10:00 am.

From 10:00 – 12:00 he will present a slide show sharing his artistic vision, turning and carving concepts.

We will break for lunch from 12:00-1:00. (lunch is included) From 1:00-3:00 Ron will demonstrate the tools and techniques that create his remarkable works of art.
